Students have really impressed us with their problem solving skills in a variety of activities, from puzzles, escape rooms and building bridges to creative writing problem solving. Those students who attended 'Artists Solve Problems' redesigned some of their favourite objects. Students designed a trainer and a new version of the Saturn Space Rocket. Those students who joined 'A Problem Solved' writing activity had a group discussion about who they know that might give good advice. Students used imaginary problems in the form of letters written to an agony aunt, the students replied to these letters giving advice. Some fantastic examples were produced.

Throughout the whole day students engaged well with all activities and an enjoyable day was had by all.
