Students from class 7 and two extra students, took part in the regional round of the Panathlon competition on Thursday 29th June 2023; this was for the whole of Coventry, Solihull Warwickshire. Panathlon is a sports event that students take part in a circuit of activities, in which they score points for the team. Most activities consist of target throwing skill games. Students represented our school fantastically - they all took turns on activities sensibly and showed great to support to each other. The level of competition was high, and we were competing against 4 other schools who had to qualify to be there too. Proudly, we can say we came away with the silver medal and second place on the day. Well done all those students who took part!



Out of Africa

There is excitement in Science because our giant African snails are finally awake after hibernating over the winter. Our hardy snails have survived the cold Corley conditions by staying inactive for the Autumn and Spring terms and, sensibly, staying inside their shells. The famous five are now active and munching away on a diet of cucumber and cuttlefish. The cuttlefish provides calcium for their growth and repair of their shells and egg laying.

On 7th June 2023, we had our first batch of eggs laid which was so exciting!

The giant African snail can grow to the size of a human arm from hand to elbow and can live for about five to six years. Students have been enjoying the hands on experience.



Drama Enrichment Performance

On Wednesday 17th May 2023, the Drama Enrichment group gave a wonderful performance of "Dave Whittington" at the Village Hall. This was the first year since before the pandemic that students were able to perform on the Village hall stage. Miss Lewis and Mrs Lyons were so proud of the way in which the

students took on the pressure of performing to the whole school as well as parents. The performance was a HUGE success.



Key Stage 3 NHS Careers Session

As part of Key Stage PSHCE and careers curriculum, Classes 4 and 5 participated in a NHS careers information session. We enjoyed learning about different careers and found out that there are more than 350 careers within the NHS. The nurses bought lots of resources for us to explore including blood pressure monitors and heart rate monitors. Students also looked at the inside of the human body using the model.







DofE Silver Qualifying Expedition

Post 16 Students braved constant drizzle and endless insects on their Silver Qualifying Expedition from 28th to 30th June 2023. Despite facing many difficulties we kept moving forwards. Tents were constructed while it was raining, and the students showed excellent resilience to keep working together. Students were enthusiastic to assist with cooking the evening meal and maintaining the fire. The sense of teamwork was palpable as everybody looked after one another; if one student felt down because their ankle was sore, another student would encourage them. When we were forced to halt our forward progress after coming up to a footpath that was totally blocked by crops, the students barely complained and accepted the new route once it was found. Breakdown and tidying of camp was also smooth, with everybody helping and doing their part. The aim of the expedition was to inspect the quality of public footpath signs, and we found plenty of examples of poorly maintained markers to be included in their reports. Students who completed this expedition will receive their awards in September.

From Monday 3rd to Friday 7th July 2023, 16 students along with staff, embarked on their residential visit to Plas Dol-y-Moch. Students joined one of two groups; the Adventure Challenge Group with Mr Thornton or the Relaxation Group with Ms Lewis. increase their ability to focus and concentrate for the whole lesson, to communicate with others and to be proud of their achievements. Well done everyone!








Thank you!

HPV schedule changes from September 2023

From 1st September 2023, the HPV vaccine programme is changing. What does this mean for your child?

CURRENT YEAR 8 PUPILS- If your child has received one dose of HPV vaccine, they are fully vaccinated and will not require a second dose

ALL OTHER YEARS- If your child has already received at least one dose of the vaccine prior to September 2023, they will not require a second dose

MISSED HPV VACCINATION—If your child has missed the HPV vaccine at school, please contact the Immunisation Team on 02476 961422.
