This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils’ music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

KEY STAGE 3 –

Students currently have one lesson a week of Music timetabled, reflecting the ambitions of the Model Music Curriculum, exploring different musical genres and history and aiming to develop skills in Listening, Singing, Performing, Composing and Evaluating.

KEY STAGE 4 –

Students have two double lessons timetable each week, where they choose an instrument to study (usually vocals, guitar, bass, drums, and ukulele) and work towards gaining RockschooL graded qualifications, which have an equivalent Level 1 or Level 2 grade. Students then enter for video exams when ready and these can be during any of three exam periods each year. The outcomes can be:

- Gain a Level 1 or 2 equivalent (graded exams) RockschooL qualification
- Gain the practical skills necessary to go onto Level 1/2/3 vocational music courses at college.

In the Year 10/11 Life skills pathway we have one lesson a week to revisit topics covered in Year 8/9 with the intention of building on, and developing, learning and practical skills.

We also recognise the needs of individual students at Corley Academy. For example, a Year 10 student is currently receiving 1:1 GCSE Music tuition from Adele’s School of Music and will be sitting his exam in Summer 2025.

Part B: Extra-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

At Corley Academy, we also encourage students to engage in other musical activities during the week. These are currently limited to lunchtime clubs and Wednesday afternoon Music Enrichment, due to the transport arrangements we have at school.

In Music Enrichment, students from both KS3 and KS4 can develop their instrumental skills and work towards a RockschooL qualification on their chosen instrument. Other musical experiences are introduced in these sessions too, reflecting the needs and interests of the students.

The latest school Rock Band formed in spring 2024 and meets Tuesday lunchtimes. We hope to develop another band as more of our students become proficient on their instruments.

We launched the school choir for students and staff last year and this will continue in the 2024-25 academic year on Wednesday lunchtimes. The choir is lead by Adele's Music School.

'Music Club' runs on a Thursday lunchtime for KS3 Students, providing a place for practice, self-expression, friendship and relaxation.

We are looking to start a brass group on Monday lunchtimes, hopefully later in the autumn term.

Students are informed of relevant musical opportunities that are offered by organisations such as Coventry Music and Solihull Music, if appropriate.

We do not currently have visiting music tutors for 1:1 tuition on other instruments, but help finding private music tutors for instrumental lessons will always be available.

Part C: Musical Experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

Students at Corley Academy also have the opportunity to experience music outside of lessons, clubs and Music Enrichment.

In the past, we have had students performing at Coventry Music's annual summer showcase at Warwick Arts Centre and The Belgrade Theatre. Students also took part in an Orchestra for All workshop and a Music/Performing arts program culminating in a performance of Jack and The Beanstalk at the Albany Theatre. We have also had musical performance at our 'Party in the Park,' Platinum Jubilee and Coronation parties.

Our summer music showcase in 2024 was a great success. We hope to build on this by running smaller showcases in the autumn and spring terms, and building on the success of the summer showcase format.

We plan to continue to visit Warwick Arts Centre to attend their monthly lunchtime concerts, taking as many different student as is possible to experience live music.

We hope to develop links and invite Warwick University's Music department into school to offer song writing and music making workshops.

We plan to invite a guest pianist into school on a regular basis to play a wide range of music to our students on our new school piano.

We will continue to look out for further musical experience for our students so that they can experience the pleasure of live music, through our Coventry Music Hub and other organisations in the area.

In the future

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.

As a school, we aim to keep developing our students' musical experience so that they can develop an understanding and passion for music, so they enjoy listening to music, attending music concerts, and develop their skills on musical instruments.
